## **KNOW YOUR RIGHTS**



Education is a **Right**, *Not* a Privilege.

## If You Are <u>Suspended</u> or <u>Expelled</u>:

- Contact your parent/guardian and ask for them to be with you in any meetings with the principal, viceprincipal, or other school officials.
- Request a report of the incident, all disciplinary and educational files, and all school assignments that will be missed. (Discipline letters/notices must be provided in your parents' native language.)
- If you are facing expulsion, you have the right to request a hearing to protect your rights.
- If you have a disability, or an IEP or a Section 504 Plan, you may have additional rights and protections!

## → If You Are <u>Stopped/Arrested</u> By Police:

- First, ask if you are **free to go**.
  - o If "no," you must stay.
  - If "yes," you can calmly walk away for your safety, do not run!
- If you are told you are not free to go, respond by saying:
  - "I want to remain silent."
    - (Name and DOB still must be given.)
  - "I want to talk with my parents or guardians."
  - "I want to talk to a lawyer."
  - "I do not consent to a search of me, my things, or my phone."
  - "Can I reach into my pocket/purse for my ID?"
- If you receive a ticket or notice of a court date, get a lawyer.
  - (You may qualify for a court-appointed attorney if you are in District Court.)
- You **DO NOT** have to write down or make any statements about what happened.
- You **DO NOT** have to sign any documents (before speaking with advocate/lawyer).
- You CAN ask police or school resource officers (SROs) if you are free to go.
- You CAN tell police or SROs that they do not have your permission to search your body, things, or phone. (If a search occurs, then it is without consent.)
- You CAN remain silent, ask to talk to your parents/guardians and/or a lawyer.
- Only your parent/guardian has the right to withdraw or transfer you to another school.
